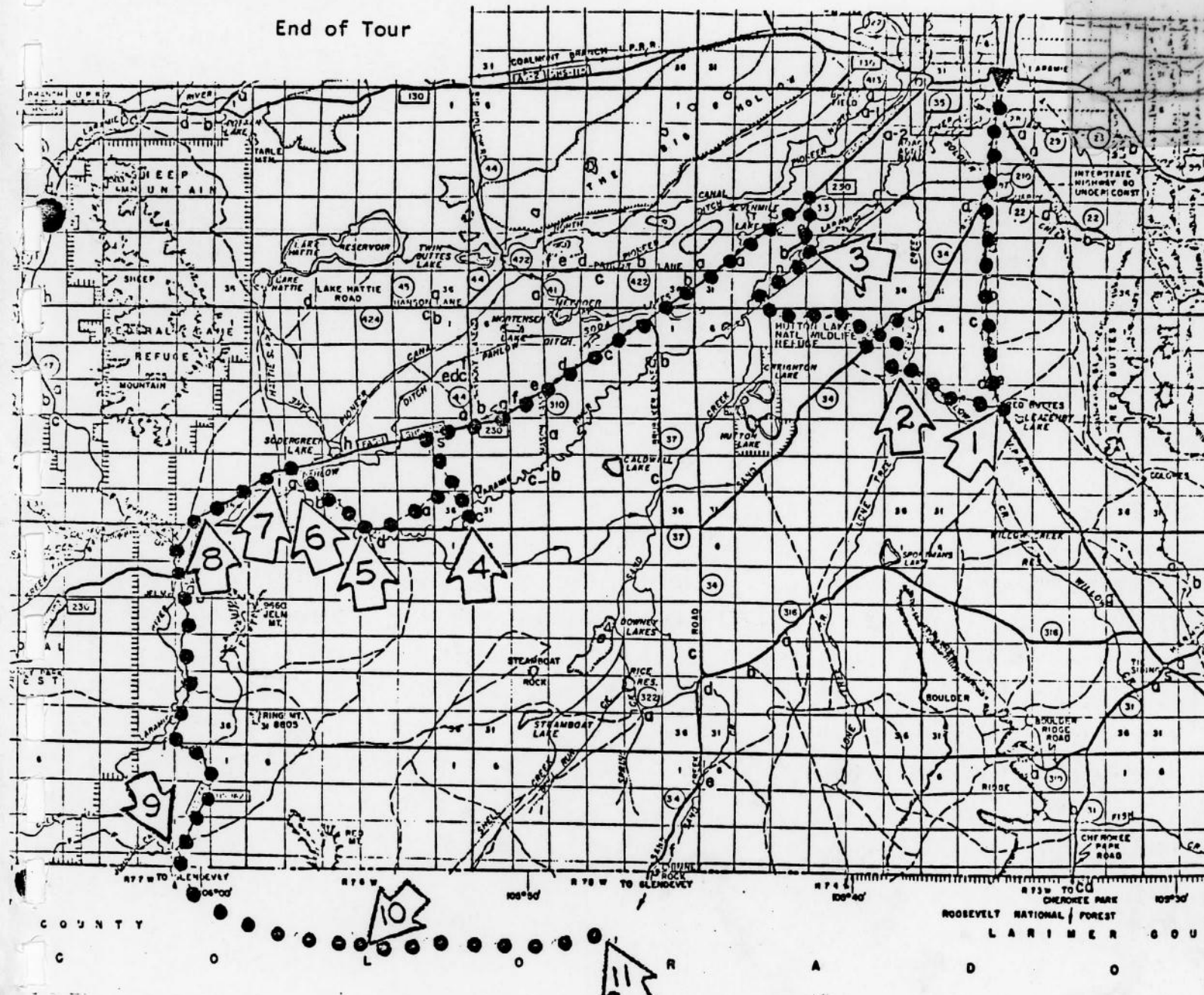

BSG LARAMIE RIVER OLD TIME RANCH TOUR

Centenary Anniversary: "100 years of Beef from Laramie
Plains Grass"

The Laramie Plains can well be called the cradle of the western livestock industry for it was on these plains that the Pioneers noted the fat wild life including deer, elk, antelope, and buffalo. The Indians came every summer for the fine hunting afforded here and there was much warfare among the tribes for the privilege of using these plains for a summer hunting ground.

The first written reference to the discovery that abandoned work oxen, thin from a long summer of work on the trail, would turn up fat in the spring was also recorded on these Laramie Plains. (Wyoming's Pioneer Ranches, pp. 3-14) A confirmation of the incident is related by John Alsop about his father, Tom Alsop, finding abandoned oxen of Ed Creighton, fat and healthy after a winter spent in the area southwest of Laramie has been found by the writer in December 1969. (Leonard, L. U. Building First Pacific Telegraph Line. Boise Newspaper, Creighton University Library). This item states that Ed Creighton sent out as far as Fort Sanders, something like 150 head of oxen in the late fall of 1860. The oxen reached Fort Sanders in November. The Fort was short of fodder and it was decided to turn the oxen loose in a protected valley about 16 miles southwest of that place, where there was fine feed, and let the oxen hustle for themselves during the winter. In the spring when Creighton was ready to start work on the telegraph line he sent one of his men (probably Tom Alsop RHB) out from Fort Sanders to learn how many of the oxen had survived and how many more he would have to bring out from Omaha, to make up the losses. The animals were found, to everyone's great surprise, in fine shape and health. Mr. Creighton remarked that he now knew that these western valleys were good for and this was the real beginning of large investments in cattle in later years.

Mr. Creighton formed the firm of Creighton, Hutton and Alsop and in late 1869 established one of the first livestock ranches in the West at the site of the Big Laramie Stage Crossing and that is the Heart Ranch which has come down to this time and will be the third stop on our tour today.

This tour is sponsored by the Wyoming University Summer School, the Albany County Historical Society and the Laramie Kiwanis Club.

Bring your car, lunch, drinking water, mosquito dope and a grand sense of adventure and join this tour which leaves the ALBANY COUNTY COURTHOUSE SQUARE promptly at 8:00 a.m. The caravan must keep together. We set our speed on the preliminary tour at 60 mph on oiled main highways, and 30 mph and less on country gravel roads.

The Wyoming State Patrol will guide us on the oiled roads. Please be prompt in taking off after each stop and let the lead cars go out ahead. We will cross the railroad in some places so be very CAREFUL.

The locations of the ranches to be visited are shown on the accompanying map in chronological order as follows:

3. Heart or Hutton Ranch. Creighton, Hutton & Alsop. Charles Hutton, etc. Present Operator, Cole Abbott.
4. Riverside Ranch. Ealch and Bacon, Schmidt, etc. (Tarkio Farms), present owner Ray Lewis.
5. Olson Ranch. Hans Olson, Ralph Holland and present owner Wm. Windsor.
6. Sodergreen Ranch. Oscar Sodergreen, Schmidt, etc. (Tarkio Farms). Present owner Ray Lewis.
7. Mountain Meadow Ranch. Jake Lund, Baby Peggy Montgomery, Embree. Present owner Wm. Windsor.
8. Coswell Ranch. N. K. Coswell, C. J. Oviatt, Etc. Present owner, Wm. Hunt Estate.
9. Hutton Horse Ranch. Tatham Bros. U-T Ranch, etc. Present owner Richard Leake.
10. Diamond Tail Ranch. Martin Bros., A. D. V. Baldwin, Charley Owen, Jim Vanderwork, A. Benzinger and present owner, Morton White.

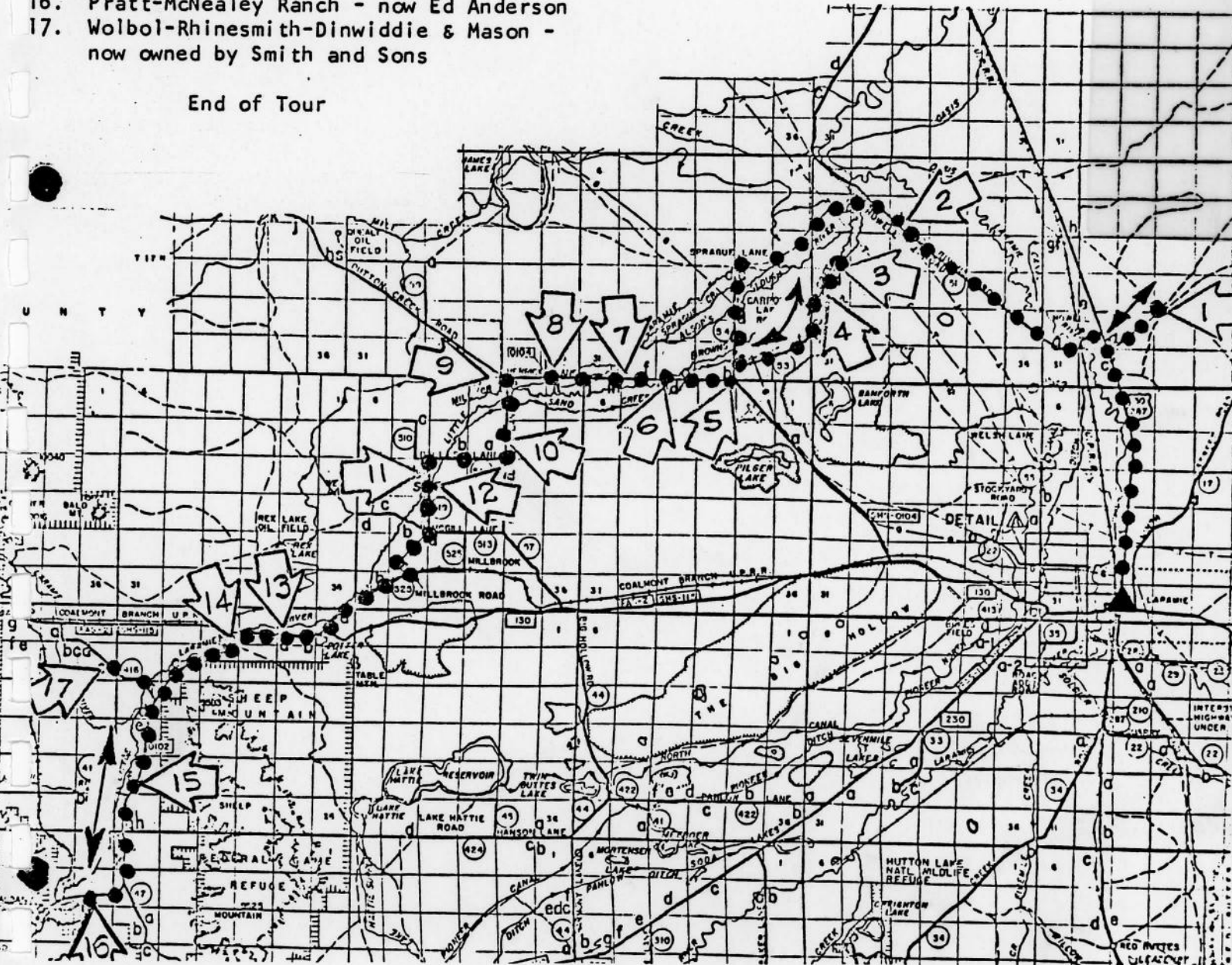

The Little Laramie Valley has always been known for its fine hay crops and accordingly was the site of the first haying operations on the Laramie Plains. When the army at Fort Sanders needed hay for its horses it contracted with early day ranchers to furnish hay. In fact some of the hostlers etc. at the Fort, including Mike Carroll, took some of these contracts to cut and deliver native hay to the Fort. Ed Farrell was another hay contractor as was Bob Homer and Charley Hutton.

When English investors were attracted to the Valley, while on hunting and exploration trips, some of them stayed and developed large ranches and raised some of the finest livestock, particularly horses. The Douglas-Willan, Sartoris Company at its Millbrook Ranch, spent large sums of money not only in the Little Laramie Valley, but also in the mines at Keystone and at other ranches near Douglas.

There are so many early day ranches in the Little Laramie Valley that it is not possible to visit all of them. The first ranches were on the Big Laramie River, but shortly afterwards the ranches on the Little Laramie were settled and developed. The following stops will give the tour members some idea of the great variety of people who followed ranching in the Little Laramie Valley since the 1870's.

(Bring your car, lunch, drinking water, mosquito dope, and a top sense of adventure and join the tour which leaves the ALLANY COUNTY COURTHOUSE SQUARE promptly at 7:00 A.M. The caravan speeds have been set on the preliminary tour schedule. On oiled highways it is 60 mph., while on country gravel roads it is 30 mph or less, according to road conditions. The Wyoming Highway Patrol will guide us on the oiled highways. We cross the railroad in some places so be very CAREFUL.)

1. King Brothers, Frank, Bert and Joe King. Frank Bosler and Howard Carroll. World Famous Sheep breeding establishment of King Brothers who developed Rambouillet and Corriedale Sheep in this area.
2. Biddick Ranch. One of the first Shorthorn ranches in the State and still raising fine Shorthorns. Started by Jack Biddick and now operated by his daughter Ethel Biddick.
3. Pascoe Ranch. Three Bar Ranch. Paul Pascoe, Jim Coen, Otto Lurns, and present owner, Thos. H. Page.
4. Carroll Ranch. Started by Mike Carroll and carried on through three generations by Tom Carroll, and now Mrs. Tom Carroll and Howard Carroll.
5. Alsop Ranch. Ellsworth Chase, Tom Alsop, etc. Present owner Ralph May.

6. Bath Ranch (Stone House) Henry Bath, Fred Bath, Al Bath, Phil Bath, etc.
Present owner of Stone House, Al Sherwood. Bath Brothers, Earl, Alwyn and Harry Bath.
7. Fleming Ranch. Douglas-Willan Sartoris & Co. E. J. Bell
Present owner A. Wessels.
8. Judson-Black-Sutphin-Fisher-Herrick-Palmer Ranch. Whitney-Carroll
